Type I Primarily red-headed individuals and blonds with light complexions.

Type II, III The largest percentage of Caucasian individuals fall into these categories.

Type IV Individuals of Asian, American Indian, Mediterranean and Latin American descent.

Type V Light complexion African American individuals, those of Indian descent.

Type VI Dark-skinned individuals.
